# School Boundary Review Process - An Overview

## What is a School Boundary Review Process?

- A process to create and/or alter school attendance area that define the service areas of a school and/or a program within the jurisdiction of the Board.
- Guided by Operating Policy I-29 and Administrative Procedure VI-88.
- Based on a Criteria approach:
  1. Optimizing the use of existing school facilities;
  2. Minimizing the use of portable classrooms whenever possible;
  3. To the extent possible, minimizing school boundary adjustments over the long-term;
  4. Optimize the cost-effective use of school transportation and maximizing walkers to school;
  5. Ensure that classroom organizations are sustainably sized according to Ministry loading requirements; and,
  6. To the extent possible, give due consideration to the concept of a neighbourhood and Catholic School community.

# School Boundary Review Process - An Overview

## Who Participates in the Process?

- School Boundary Review Committee (SBRC) is to be created to advise the process.
- The SBRC is comprised of:
  1. Catholic School Council Chairs (or designates) of the affected school communities;
  2. Designated Family of Schools Superintendent as Chair; and,
  3. Facility Management Services and Planning Services Senior Staff.
- The task of the SBRC is to review potential options and provide objective feedback.
- Once preferred options are identified by the Committee, they are presented to the affected school communities (the public) to gather feedback.
- Once a recommended option is selected, Senior Staff will present to the Trustees to consider the recommended accommodation plan for approval.

# School Boundary Review Process - An Overview

## Why a Boundary Review in Milton?

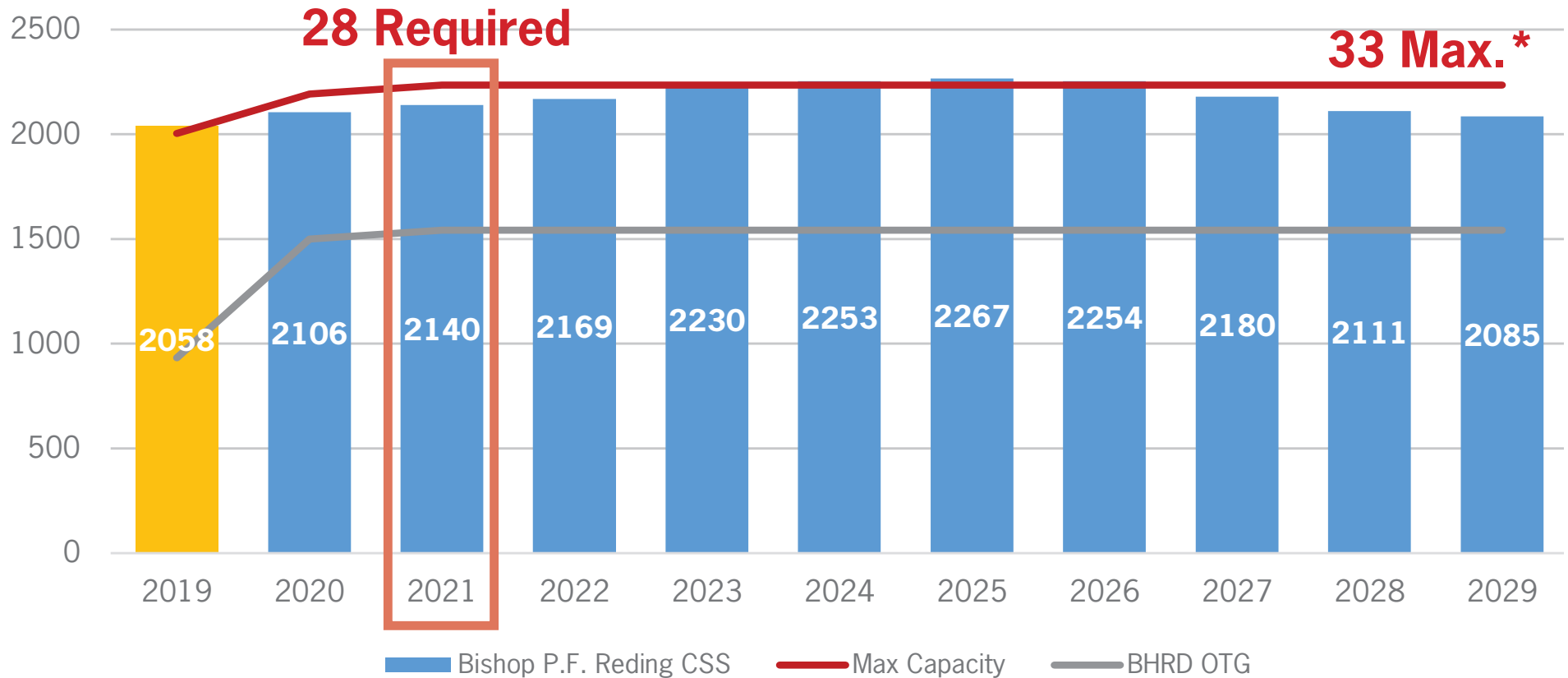
- Secondary schools in Milton are currently over-utilized at 181% of building capacity.
- Staff submitted a request for funding under the 2019 Capital Priorities program for Milton #3 CSS. The most likely opening is expected to be September 2022, if funding approved by Spring 2020.
- Even with the ongoing building addition at Bishop P.F. Reding, the school is expected to operate at well over its built capacity.
- Jean Vanier is also expected to operate at well over its built and max temporary capacity until Milton #3 CSS is opened.

## Why a Boundary Review in Milton?

- In summary, the primary needs are as follows:
  1. An interim solution to accommodate secondary students in Milton in wait for the opening of Milton #3 CSS; and,
  2. Creation of an ultimate school boundary to accommodate the future Milton #3 CSS school community.

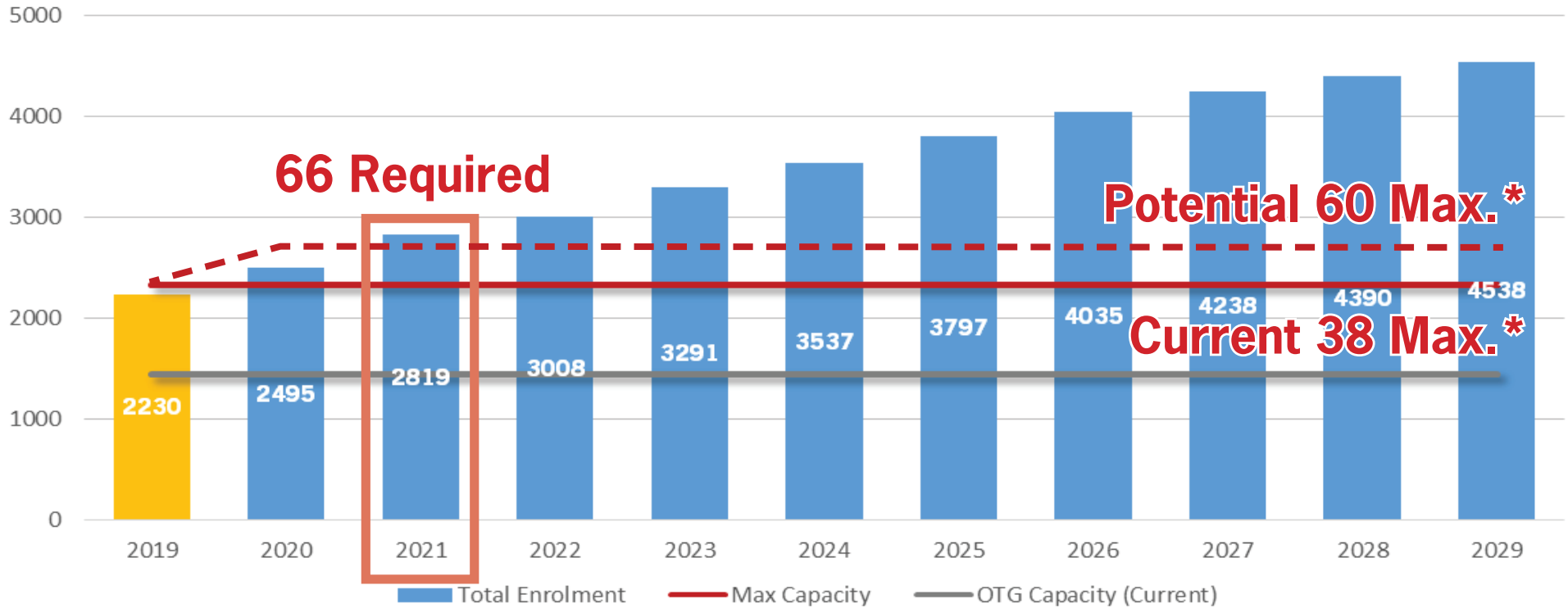
## Bishop P.F. Reding Catholic Secondary School
